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## Materials

Yardages based on 42" wide fabric

A: White AMB-1	¾ yard
B: Pool AMB-124	¾ yard
C: Dark Pool AMB-125	½ yard
D: Pewter AMB-119	¾ yard
E: Light Sky AMB-97	¼ yard
F & Binding: Navy Blue AMB-53	⅞ yard
G: Dark Tomato AMB-81	½ yard
H: Pale Blue AMB-136	¾ yard
I: Light Royal Blue AMB-91	½ yard
Backing: Royal Blue AMB-31	1 ½ yards

## Cut the Fabrics

WOF = Width of Fabric LOF = Length of Fabric

- From A: White AMB-1, cut  
31 – 4 ½" squares
- From B: Pool AMB-124, cut  
12 – 2 ½" squares  
2 – 1 ½" x WOF strips  
16 – 1 ½" x 2 ½" rectangles  
48 – 1 ½" squares
- From C: Dark Pool AMB-125, cut  
1 – 4 ½" square  
4 – 3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles  
4 – 3 ½" squares  
4 – 2 ½" squares  
2 – 1 ½" x WOF strips  
16 – 1 ½" x 2 ½" rectangles  
48 – 1 ½" squares
- From D: Pewter AMB-119, cut  
4 – 2 ½" squares  
2 – 1 ½" x WOF strips  
16 – 1 ½" x 2 ½" rectangles  
48 – 1 ½" squares
- From E: Light Sky AMB-97, cut  
4 – 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles  
8 – 2 ½" squares  
16 – 1 ½" x 2 ½" rectangles  
48 – 1 ½" squares
- From F: Navy Blue AMB-53, cut  
1 – 6 ½" square  
4 – 2 ½" squares  
5 – 2 ½" x WOF strips - binding  
2 – 1 ½" x WOF strips  
16 – 1 ½" x 2 ½" rectangles  
48 – 1 ½" squares
- From G: Dark Tomato AMB-81, cut  
16 – 2 ½" squares  
4 – 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles  
2 – 1 ½" x WOF strips  
16 – 1 ½" x 2 ½" rectangles  
48 – 1 ½" squares
- From H: Pale Blue AMB-136, cut  
1 – 4 ½" square  
8 – 2 ½" squares  
16 – 1 ½" x 2 ½" rectangles  
48 – 1 ½" squares
- From I: Light Royal Blue AMB-91, cut  
8 – 3 ½" squares  
4 – 2 ½" squares  
2 – 1 ½" x WOF strips  
16 – 1 ½" x 2 ½" rectangles  
48 – 1 ½" squares

## Directions

### Make the 12 ½" Star Block:

1. Pencil a diagonal line from corner to corner on the back of the eight 3 ½" Fabric I squares.
2. Place one square right sides together on one end of a 3 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric C rectangle (Fig. 1). Sew on the line. Trim the corner to 1/4" seam allowance. Press open. Repeat for the opposite end of the rectangle making one flying geese unit. Repeat to make 4 flying geese units.
3. Sew flying geese units to the left and right sides of the 6 ½" Fabric F square (Fig 2). Press seams toward the center square.
4. Sew a 3 ½" Fabric C square to the ends of the two remaining flying geese units from Step 2 (Fig. 2). Press seams toward the squares.
5. Sew the three units together to make one 12 ½" square.

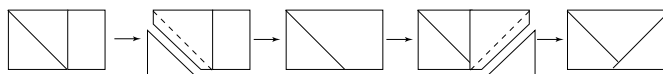

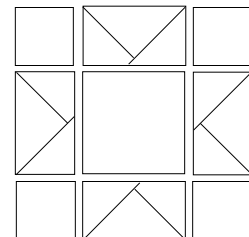

### Make two 8 ½" Star Blocks:

Repeat the general directions (from the 12 ½" Block above) to make two 8 ½" Star Blocks, one from each color combination shown below:

	Eight 2 ½" squares	Four 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles	Four 2 ½" squares	One 4 ½" square
8 ½" Star Block 1	Fabric G	Fabric E	Fabric E	Fabric C
8 ½" Star Block 2	Fabric B	Fabric G	Fabric G	Fabric H

### Make thirty-two 4 ½" Star Blocks:

Repeat the general directions to make four 4 ½" Star Blocks from each combination shown below (thirty-two blocks total).

	Eight 1 ½" squares	Four 1 ½" x 2 ½" rectangles	Four 1 ½" squares	One 2 ½" square
Combo 1	Fabric G	Fabric E	Fabric E	Fabric C
Combo 2	Fabric F	Fabric B	Fabric B	Fabric I
Combo 3	Fabric B	Fabric D	Fabric D	Fabric E
Combo 4	Fabric H	Fabric F	Fabric F	Fabric G
Combo 5	Fabric E	Fabric G	Fabric G	Fabric D
Combo 6	Fabric I	Fabric C	Fabric C	Fabric B
Combo 7	Fabric C	Fabric H	Fabric H	Fabric F
Combo 8	Fabric D	Fabric I	Fabric I	Fabric H

### Assemble the Quilt Center:

1. Lay out the pieced star blocks and the 4 ½" Fabric A squares, as shown in the quilt image.
2. Sew the blocks into horizontal rows. Combine rows 2 and 3 into one row. Combine rows 5 and 6 into one row. Combine rows 8-10 into one row. Join all the horizontal rows together to complete the quilt center.

### Add the Border:

1. Sew a Fabric I 1 ½" strip to a Fabric F strip. Press the seam toward the Fabric I strip. Sew a second set of strips of these fabrics and press toward the Fabric F strip.
2. Cut 4 ½" sections from the strip sets for a total of twelve 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles (there will be some fabric left over).
3. With Fabric G and Fabric D strips repeat Steps 1 and 2.
4. With Fabric B and Fabric C strips repeat Steps 1 and 2.
5. Using the quilt image as a guide, sew the rectangles together end to end for each border strip. Sew two sets of ten rectangles each, end to end, and sew to the left and right sides of the quilt center. Sew two sets of eight rectangles end to end for the top and bottom sides. Sew a 2 ½" Fabric H square to each end and sew to the quilt center.

### Finish the Quilt:

Layer the quilt top, backing and batting and quilt as desired. Make the binding and apply to the quilt.

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
